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

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Tony Smith has been selected as the inaugural artist in the Artist Research Project, an initiative developed by the International Network of Contemporary Art - North America (INCCA-NA).

The goal of this project is to use a community-based approach to document and research every outdoor sculpture by Tony Smith in the world using Wikipedia and Flickr, and therefor build an accurate and highly-accessible resource for the future. Along the way we hope that we'll raise awareness about the importance of his artworks and the need to take good care of them.

While Smith made over 50 outdoor sculptures, he often made them in editions, usually of three, but sometimes of more or less. Today there are over 100 outdoor sculptures by Smith in the world, located in over 20 different U.S. states, and on three continents.^[1] It is hoped that before what would have been his 100th birthday. September 23, the goal of this this project will be achieved.

The success of this project relies on those that care about Tony Smith's artworks and want to make a difference in helping to document an important contemporary artist's work in the world's most accessible and important online encyclopedia.

The process [edit]





Every Saturday during the Come Together: Surviving Sandy exhibition (October 20th - December 15th) a contemporary art conservator will be on site to conduct three-minute interviews with artists who were affected by Hurricane Sandy, asking the artists to share how the storm changed their working practices. This program is in collaboration with the International Network for the Conservation of Contemporary Art - North America.





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





